6. REPORTS / PRESENTATIONS

A. William Nez, NNVA Housing Manager

- Open invitation to Veterans, spouses, and Gold Star Parents to provide invitations on the program and the status of applications.
- During the review of applications, it was discovered that there were numbers that were duplicated.
- There have been keys turned over to numerous new homes that have been completed.
- Home Improvement Listing will be finalized by January 16, 2026. The list will be shared with the contactor. The Sparrow Group Inc. will be the Home Improvement Contractor.
- The Home Improvement List is 156 among all five agencies. The listing is organized by date of application received. The Housing program can assist Veterans with Home Improvement Applications.
- Home Improvement Applications received first are to be served first. According to the Home Improvement Policy.
- New Construction Applications – six are on the waiting list and are shovel ready.
- New Construction in Progress – eight are in different stages of construction.
- Construction completed pending utilities – nine are waiting for utilities connection. Utility companies hold up progress.
- Turn-key Completed – Six within Eastern Agency.



- Home Improvement Applications – Twenty-Three for Eastern Agency
- Surviving-Spouse Home Improvement Applications – Twenty for Eastern Agency
- Gold Star Parent Home Improvement Applications – No applications.
- Plans to provide a 2-to-3-hour comprehensive power point presentation on the ENAVO new construction project. Discussions regarding eligibility, application assistance, criteria. A date can be set for both new housing and home renovation.
- Applications are not being filled out consistently with names, and addresses. Applications not being updated as per policy.
- Currently the cost of a new Veteran home is \$400,000.00.
- Three contractors and ARPA Funds. ARPA has time limit for use. Funds must be used; projects are reassigned to different contractors. A time frame has been set to expend all the funds.
- Three types of houses, mobile homes, modular homes, stick built homes. Recommends modular homes, due to quality and less expensive, built off site, transported to site and assembled.
- SWIF was not building homes fast enough. There was a 60-mile radius for deliverance of homes.
- With the Power Point presentation, the land office and the NHA will be invited.
- Policy changes are being recommended to improve services through the Housing Program.
- Contractors need to apply with the NN Business Regulatory. A needs proposal is submitted to OOC and to be set out for bid.

Lori John, VSO, ENA

- Amends title of written report to read January 14, 2026, Becenti Chapter.
- NNVA, executive director and VSOs are committed to providing information on services provided by the NNVA, Information on the VTF and GF will be shared with CVO's and Council Delegates.
- Still updating the Veteran count, numbers changing and a daily basis. Veterans count is currently at 1449 as of 01/05/2026. Initial count was 726 Veterans; updates are being completed.
- Setback with the FMIS updates, address update, search type "P," address book establishment. Information provided to the HEHSC. 104 still pending from October, November, and December. As of January, all but eighteen were processed.
- Two budget transfers, January and April. Set appointment with Shelby Vanderver to review any transfers.
- Budget shells set up at the beginning of the FY, Veterans will be paid out according to the budget fund. Budget shells cannot be amended.
- Hardship, Energy, Self-Help, Honor/Color Guard, Burial.
- CVOs can provide membership listing for the agency to cross-reference information.
- Release of names question has been sent to DOJ for recommendation.
- OOC is short staffed, payments are late for the VTF and GF.
- Specific Home Improvement items must be listed on the NNVA 105 Form.
- Delegate Tolth recommended inviting Honorable Crotty to discuss expenditure on the GF.
- Budget transfers can only be completed with the VTF. Seventy-seven thousand was not spent on FY24. Seventeen thousand went back in FY25.

Bobbie Ann Baldwin, Executive Director, NNVA

- Housing, reaching out to delegates to work with the utility companies for hook ups.
- Workshop for the oversight committee on January 4, 2026. No delegates showed up. Fourth attempt for this workshop.
- SWIF, no limitations on milage of sixty-five miles. SWIF does now have a workforce. SWIF is not working fast enough. Another contractor has been brought on board and waiting to initiate the contract. Only Sparrow Group had applied.
- ARPA "A" – 5.6 million with 4.4 million spent, balance 1.1 million. SWIF "B" – 12.6 million 4.4 million spent, balance 8.4 million, BITCO "C" – 31.7 million, all funds spent, zero balance.
- TF Housing Contract with Sparrow Group, 21.6 million with balance of ten million.
- Home Improvement with Sparrow Group, 10.7 million pushing to get started.
- Payments being late, problem is with OOC and delegates have been informed as to OOC hiring more personnel.

- Fund 16, NNVA has no control over those funds. Memorandums and new forms are being created for the use of these funds.
- General Funds, directive sent to agencies on use by Veterans who did not register by June 25, 2025. Funds used for CVOs who ran out of VTFs.
- VTF, all Veterans registered for FY25 were paid out from the VTF. Veterans not counted were paid out from the VTF. A Journal Voucher Correction had to be submitted to correct the mistakes.
- Veterans Loan Program, over \$200,000 of outstanding uncollected loan amounts. Publications for collection.
- Accreditations, Lori John is up to date, four others need to get updated.
- Late submission of budget, many changes were made with the VTF from OPVP, only salaries and operations were allocated.
- FY22 Audit, working on twenty-three findings, with thirteen that have been addressed.
- Communication, directive to all personnel to email all participants twice a week, on Mondays and Thursdays, information on VTF and GF.
- Stipends, changes coming up with policies, missing meetings, not enough notice for meetings.
- Four positions have not been filled.
- The agency will make the determination which funds late 105s will be paid from.
- Conditions of Appropriations can be recommended to council delegates for the use of Fund 16.
- Veteran listing can be sent to the chapter officials. NNVA is waiting for a decision from DOJ.
- General Fund, Honor Guard, \$10,000, Color Guard, \$10,000, Burial \$20,000, Hardship \$130,000, Energy \$130,000, \$300,000, Self-Help. Total of \$600,000 and balance of \$390,650.
- NN Claim forms are submitted with Color/Honor Guard along with form from the NN Website.
- Payment for Color Guard, \$75.00 per member, additional \$25.00 for travel more than twenty-five miles.

NN Council Delegates – Honorable George Tolth – Agenda modified at the request of Honorable Tolth.  
 Motions on the agenda approved.

- Fund 16, Chapters are having problems making it difficult for CVOs on how to use the funds. HEHSC has requested that a directive be put in place to give guidance on the use of Fund 16.
- A draft form and memorandum will be forwarded to DOJ for approval on Fund 16. The form is to be completed and provided to Chapters.
- Chapters requesting administrative cost for managing funds.
- Increase of stipends can be amended through the VTF Policy. VTF policy should have been approved by the HEHSC, instead it was signed by former President Nez.
- When the NN Council provided funding for Veterans, there is a lack of stipulation of how the funds are to be used.
- Plans of Operations, By-Laws, and SOPs need to be established for all CVOs. NNVAC members need to be present at agency meetings to provide information.
- Fund 16 may not be available for next FY. Fundings are slowly going down.
- Chapter Discretionary Funds should be available for Veterans and is not considered as "double dipping." Additional recommendations have been requested through DOJ.
- Request for additional funding due to the increase of the ENA Veterans count. Must be done with all agencies.

Kyle Lewis, Chairperson, NNVAC

- From Dilkon, AZ area, retired USMC 1<sup>st</sup> Sgt. CVO Cmdr. for month and half, AVO Cmdr. for 8 months, NNVAC Chair for 3 months.
- Title 2 signed in November, 180 days given to incorporate a Plan of Operation and Code of Conduct.
- All five agencies are not on the same page; SOPs must be developed for all five agencies. Plans for servicemembers coming out of the service to transition into civilian life.
- Ft. Defiance Agency meetings are held once a quarter. Communication between the leadership and VSOs are a vital part of the organization.

- Resolutions passed at the past NNVAC Work Session. Subject items discussed by Mr. Kyle Lewis, NNVAC Chairperson.

- Announcement was made that Mr. Tim Johnson, Chinle AVO Commander is ne newly appointed Veterans Liaison with OPVP. Mr. Johnson resigned from the NNVAC.

Resolution: ENAVO-26-004

**The Eastern Navajo Agency Veterans' Organization (ENAVO) formally issues this resolution to declare a vote of "No Confidence" in Bobbie A. Baldwin, the Executive Director of the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration (NNVA).**

**Whereas:**

1. The Eastern Navajo Agency Veterans Organization (ENAVO) serves as a vital advocate for thirty-one (31) Chapter Veteran Organizations (CVOs) within the Eastern Navajo Agency. ENAVO is charged with the responsibility of representing these CVOs, ensuring that their voices and concerns are effectively communicated and addressed. ENAVO strives to support the interests and welfare of Veterans with each of the thirty-one CVOs, facilitating coordinated representation and promoting their rights and needs within the Eastern Navajo Agency; and
2. Pursuant to the Navajo Nation Council (NNC) Resolution CJA-3-16, the Navajo Nation Veterans Act, the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration (NNVA), and the Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council (NNVAC) were established under the Office of the President and Vice (OPVP). These entities are tasked with acting in the best interest of Navajo Nation Veterans. Their primary responsibilities are to ensure the delivery of quality services to Veterans and promoting active participation of Veterans in the development of relevant policies; and
3. Pursuant to NNC Resolution CJA-3-16, (the Veterans Act), the NNVA Executive Director has disregarded and neglected to consult with the NNVAC, the Five Agency Veterans Organizations, and the 110 CVOs. This includes not responding to multiple requests for the NNVA Director's presence at Health, Education and Human Services Committee (HEHSC) meetings. This behavior of continued practice to ignore and disregard repeated requests to attend such meetings has hindered transparency, accountability, directly contravenes the responsibilities outlined in the Veterans Act. This lack of responsibility has resulted in insufficient communication and transparency between the NNVA and the entities representing the interests of Navajo Nation Veterans and making it difficult for the HEHSC to monitor the NNVA's actions and ensure that the needs of Navajo Veterans are addressed; and
4. Pursuant to NN Legislation HEHSCAU-12-16, Sections II, Objectives, III, Purposes, V, Personnel, VI, Authorities & Responsibilities, it is noted that the Director of the NNVA has not fully met the responsibilities outlined in the Plan of Operation. The Navajo Nation Council enacted CJY-46-98 establishing the Veterans Trust Fund, which states: "The purpose of the Navajo Nation Veterans Trust Fund is to provide funding for veterans' programs, projects and services or activities which may include, but not limited to program/project development, community/economic development, housing, training, and

employment opportunities, leveraging or matching funds for exemplary projects, protection and advocacy services, financial assistance of benefits and services, education and scholarship, and survivors' benefits for the surviving spouses of deceased veterans." The phrase "may include, but not limited to" in CJY-46-98 clearly indicates that the list of allowable uses is illustrated rather than restrictive, and no administrative official has the authority to narrow or redefine the purposes of authorized by the Navajo Nation Council; and

5. The Veterans Housing Program has experienced notable lack of advocacy, prioritization, and administrative oversight, resulting in inadequate services for Navajo Nation Veterans. The failure to effectively manage the Housing Program has contributed to broader issues within the NNVA, diminished effectiveness in addressing the housing needs and welfare of Veterans, a significant lapse in advocacy, prioritization, and administrative oversight for Navajo Veterans has resulted in inadequate coordination of essential services for this population; and
6. The NNVA Executive Director has failed to establish a comprehensive and accurate census of Navajo Veterans. This census should comprise of vital demographic information, including detailed data on Veterans' housing status and relevant details that are critical to understanding and meeting the needs of the Veteran population. The absence of demographic records directly impedes and hinders efforts to ensure the welfare and housing needs are effectively addressed; and
7. When the NNVA Director assumed her position, the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration was fully staffed. Veterans held critical roles, including Veteran Service Officers (VSOs), the NNVA Deputy Director, and personnel within the NNVA Office. Housing personnel were assigned across all five agency offices to support operations. The U.S. Department of Veteran's Affairs certified NN VSOs to offer VA Compensation and Disability assistance to Navajo Nation Veterans. Currently only two of the five agencies have certified VSOs. The VSOs not only provide direct support but are also responsible for managing agency offices and overseeing fiduciary responsibilities within the administration; and
8. Reports from both current and former employees indicate significant issues a toxic work environment and staff morale. Allegations include violations of DPM personnel policies, inconsistent practices and procedures, and unrealistic, demanding schedules. Staff members have faced extended work hours, the necessity to travel using personal vehicles, and uncompensated duties that exceed the scope of their position. These conditions have led to an overworked and demoralized workforce within the NNVA.


**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

1. The Eastern Navajo Agency Veterans Organization hereby formally declares a vote of **"No Confidence"** in Bobbie A. Baldwin, Executive Director of the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration (NNVA). This action is taken after careful consideration of numerous concerns regarding the leadership and administrative management of the NNVA, as detailed in the preceding sections of this resolution. This resolution is intended to address the significant issues identified in the operation and oversight. The concerns raised include failures in advocacy, prioritization, and administrative oversight, lack of transparency, insufficient consultation with relevant Veteran organizations, inadequate management of the Veterans Housing Program, and failure to establish a comprehensive census of Navajo Veterans.  
These issues have collectively impacted the welfare and effective representation of Navajo Nation Veterans. Based on these documented concerns, ENAVO has determined that the continued leadership of the current NNVA Executive Director is not in the best interest of the Navajo Nation Veterans. This resolution calls for consideration of the removal of Bobbie A. Baldwin from the position of Executive Director, NNVA, to ensure that the needs and interests of Navajo Nation Veterans are adequately addressed moving forward.
