RESOLUTION OF THE
ADVISORY COMMITTEE OF THE
NAVAJO TRIBAL COUNCIL

Confirming Members to Serve
on the Navajo Veterans Commission

WHEREAS:

1. By Resolution CJA-1-81, the Navajo Tribal Council gave the Advisory Committee of the Navajo Tribal Council the power to confirm members of Commissions which are established by the Navajo Tribal Council; and

2. The Navajo Tribal Council by Resolution CF-14-82, established the Navajo Veterans Commission; and

3. Pursuant to the Navajo Veterans Commission's Plan of Operation adopted by Advisory Committee Resolution ACAU-104-84, procedures to ensure fairness was developed for the nomination of two (2) eligible and qualified Navajo Veterans Representatives by Navajo Veterans in each of the five (5) agencies and one (1) representative nominated by the Office of the Chairman; and

4. Selections of nominees by Navajo Veterans in each of the five agencies are set forth on Exhibit "A" attached hereto; and

5. The selection and nomination of one representative by the Office of the Chairman is attached as Exhibit "B" hereto; and

6. The Navajo Veterans Commission with the support from the Chairman/Vice Chairman's Office urges the Advisory Committee to confirm the appointments of the Navajo Veterans as set forth on Exhibits "A" and "B" attached hereto, to serve as representatives on the Navajo Veterans Commission.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:
